Child Labour in Pakistan: Including the Excluded Zaigham Mazhar, 2012-06 Children from poor families in Pakistan like in many of developing countries tend to work at early age and typically have lowest educational level and suffer other social disadvantages Child labour is usually linked with low human capital investment poor education and health and future poverty incidence Low rates of productivity growth further contribute to the intergenerational poverty trap and hamper economic growth This persistent problem means a loss of future human resource development of country and the denial of children s birth right to education and recreation There is a desperate need to find out effective tools for re integration of children especially who are trapped in Worst Form of Child Labour which may be helpful for reduction of child labour and eventually may eliminate this problem under the prevailing socio economic conditions of the country This research will be helpful as a useful reference in efforts to find out effective counterfactuals for eradication of WFCL in Pakistan

Fongot Kini-Yen, 2012-05-15 This is a complex volume that combines a good deal of survey data on Bakassi and its populations with more ethnographically based insights into the conditions of the Bakassi communities The book is the outcome of research carried out by Fongot Kini between 2004 and 2009 The work is intended to serve as first hand exhaustive information on the live situation in the contested Bakassi Cameroon Nigeria border region The term Bakassi engenders multiple meanings loaded with many conflicting emotional spiritual and material interests Native inhabitants are systematically disinherited of their ancestral cultural heritage and socio economic resources They are bastardised humiliated and scammed by unscrupulous opportunists who deliberately misidentify them with intentions of dispossessing them of their ancestral lands and natural resources Overall the author is in sympathy with the Bakassi who he argues have been marginalised and neglected by the Cameroon state In particular the value of the indigenous communities in terms of local economies as well as securing this vital border area has not been

recognised and various external groups have been either allowed or encouraged to settle there to both the detriment of local populations and to the security of the region

The State of Child Labor in South Asia, 1999 Comprises 21 papers which review the state of child labour in South Asia and examine initiatives to combat the problem

Exclusion, Gender and Education Maureen A. Lewis, Marlane E. Lockheed, 2007 Girls have achieved remarkable increases in primary schooling over the past decade yet millions are still not in school In their previous book *Inexcusable Absence* Maureen A Lewis and Marlane E Lockheed reported the startling new finding that nearly threequarters of the girls who are not in school belong to ethnic religious linguistic racial or other minorities In this companion volume they further analyze the determinants of school enrollment completion and learning in seven countries the highly heterogeneous populations of Laos China Pakistan India and Guatemala and the homogeneous populations of Bangladesh and Tunisia The authors find that in ethnically and linguistically diverse populations minority groups minority girls in particular lag significantly behind the majority population in school attendance while highly homogeneous populations like Bangladesh and Tunisia have successfully integrated girls into school on a par with boys By increasing understanding about the major impediments to universal primary education *Exclusion Gender and Education* provides valuable new knowledge to those who are working to bring gender equity to the education systems of poor countries
