Thurlow,2016 During the 2015 16 school year 25 states used assessments aligned to college and career ready standards developed by consortia of states i e Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers PARCC Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium Smarter Balanced as their accountability assessments The participation of students with disabilities in all state and district administered assessments is required by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act IDEA which also requires that they be provided accommodations as appropriate The Elementary and Secondary Education Act ESEA confirms the participation requirements for students with disabilities and adds requirements for the participation of English learners ELs in state administered assessments With the reauthorization of ESEA in 2015 IDEA requirements for reporting on the number of

students using accommodations was confirmed the reauthorization added the requirement that accommodations be provided to ELs for both content and English Language Proficiency ELP assessments This report provides a snapshot of how accommodations were included in policies across ACT SAT PARCC and Smarter Balanced during the 2015 16 school year Data for this analysis were obtained through the examination and analysis of publicly available information including accommodations manuals and other policy documents There was wide variation in the accessibility and accommodations policies of ACT SAT PARCC and Smarter Balanced in 2015 16 The results of the analysis are organized as follows 1 the accessibility and accommodations approach of each assessment 2 a crosswalk of the approaches of the assessments and 3 the specific accommodations that were allowed for each of the assessments This analysis strongly indicates that there is a need for more research The following are appended 1 Documents Used in Analysis 2 Documentation Requirements and 3 Specific Accommodations
